Dr Georgios Tsoulfas received his medical degree from Brown University School of Medicine in 1998 and completed his General Surgery residency at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in 2004, as well as a transplant research fellowship at the Starzl Transplant Institute at the University of Pittsburgh. He then completed a two-year transplantation surgery fellowship at the Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School between 2004-2006, and then joined the Division of Solid Organ Transplantation and Hepatobiliary Surgery at the University of Rochester Medical Center as an Assistant Professor of Surgery. He has currently moved back to Greece where in 2012 he became a member of the faculty of the Aristotle University School of Medicine, elected as an Assistant Professor of Surgery. He is currently an Associate Professor of Surgery – Transplantation Surgery and Chief at the Department of Transplantation Surgery at the Aristotle University School of Medicine. He has published over 124 papers in peer-reviewed Journals and in PubMed, as well as 38 book chapters. He has edited 6 books and is a reviewer for 30 International Journal and on the Editorial Board of several others. His H-index is 21 and he has 1397 citations and an impact factor (IF) of 366 from papers in PubMed.

The recipient of awards such as the Edward E. Mason award for excellence in patient care and education, he is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and a member of a number of professional organizations including the TTS, the American Society of Transplant Surgeons, Association for Academic Surgery, International College of Surgeons, American College of Surgeons, International Liver Transplantation Society, Society for Laparoscopic Surgeons and International HepaticoPancreaticoBiliary Association (IHPBA). Dr Tsoulfas is the recipient of the American College of Surgeons International Guest Scholarship. He is and has served as a member of multiple committees, including the International Relations Committee of the American College of Surgeons and the International Relations Committee of the American

HepaticoPancreaticoBiliary Association (AHPBA). Dr Tsoufas is currently the president of the Greek Chapter of the International College of Surgeons, as well as World President of the International College of Surgeons and Chair of the International Relations Committee of the American College of Surgeons. He is also a member of the AHPBA and the IHPBA Education and Training Committees. At the Aristotle University School of Medicine he is head of the Hellenic Diaspora Medical Forum (HDMF) since 2020.

His clinical and research interests include hepatobiliary surgery, primary and secondary hepatic malignancies, ischemia/reperfusion injury, solid organ transplantation, as well as medical/surgical education and the use of technology. One of the key research areas is that of 3D Printing of Solid Organs, with an emphasis on hepatic tumors, in order to facilitate surgical intervention and surgical education. This is a collaborative program with the Department of Surveying and Rural Engineering of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, which is funded by the European Union.
