Themistoklis Ioanni Dagklis is an Assistant Professor in Obstetrics and Gynecology, 3<sup>rd</sup> University Clinic of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, "Ippokrateio" Hospital, Thessaloniki, Greece.

He was born in Thessaloniki, Greece on 21 August 1976.

He received his medical degree in 2000 from the School of Medicine, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece, with distinction.

He completed his specialization in Obstetrics and Gynecology in the 4<sup>th</sup> University Clinic of Obstetrics and Gynecology, "Ippokrateio" Hospital, Thessaloniki, Greece in 2011.

He has received several awards, including the first prize and scholarship “G. Papanikolaou” for the best research proposal in the field of Obstetrics and Gynecology in Greece (2016-18).
